Department of Sanskrit Studies, under the School of Indian Heritage at Ramakrishna Mission Vivekananda Educational and Research Institute (RKMVERI) (Deemed-to-be-University declared by Government of India under Section 3 of UGC Act, 1956), Belur Math is organizing a 3-day national level seminar on Sanskrit to commemorate the 150th birth anniversary of Swami Abhedananda in compliance with the resolution of the Governing Body of Ramakrishna Mission, with financial support from the Ministry of Culture, Government of India.

Swami Abhedananda is a monastic direct disciple of Bhagavan Sri Ramakrishna Paramahansa and a brother disciple of Swami Vivekananda. He was a multi-faceted personality- erudite scholar, prolific writer and powerful speaker who was commissioned by Swami Vivekananda to preach Vedanta in the West. He preached Vedanta, Yoga and the glorious Indian Spiritual Heritage to Western audiences in America and Europe for nearly 25 years from 1896 to 1921. His mastery over Sanskrit is evidenced by his devotional outpourings in the form of hymns to Sri Ramakrishna, Holy Mother Sri Sarada Devi and Swami Vivekananda composed in mellifluous Sanskrit.

It is our honour and privilege to commemorate his 150th birth anniversary through this national seminar on Sanskrit.

Papers are invited for presentation in this Seminar in parallel sessions from monks, research scholars and teachers on the themes mentioned below.

1. Papers should be in Sanskrit language (Maximum limit 3000 words).
2. Original and hitherto unpublished papers alone will be accepted. In this regard the author should write a note of self-declaration while sending the paper.
3. Please type in Unicode font only. Handwritten manuscripts will not be accepted.
4. Both word and pdf files should be sent by email.
5. Please mention "Paper for Sanskrit Seminar Jan 2018" as the subject of the e-mail and send it to sanskrit.rkmvu@gmail.com (No need to send any hard copy)
6. **Last date:** Papers should reach us by email within a month, that is, on or before **6 January 2018**. Papers received beyond the deadline may not be considered.
