Sanskrit gives strength: "My idea is first of all to bring out the gems of spirituality that are stored up in our books... let them be the common property of all... The great difficulty in the way is the Sanskrit language--the glorious language of ours; and this difficulty cannot be removed until--if it is possible--the whole of our nation are good Sanskrit scholars...Therefore the ideas must be taught in the language of the people; at

the same time, Sanskrit education must go on along with it, because the very sound of Sanskrit words gives a prestige and a power and a strength to the race." [ibid.,Vol3, p289-90]



Courses Offered:

- *Integrated MA* in Sanskrit (10-semesters, 3 yrs BA+2 yrs MA)
- *MPhil* (3 semesters)
- *PhD* (6-10 semesters)
- *Communicative Sanskrit*: An outreach programme of four-months. It is a weekend course (of 3 credits) for the benefit of general public in basic written and spoken Sanskrit. The three-tier course consists of the following levels:
 - 1) *Preliminary* alphabet, sentence construction, spoken Sanskrit
 - 2) *Intermediate* basic grammar, Gita and Upanishad chanting with meaning
 - 3) *Advanced* higher grammar, selections from literature, composition

Eligibility:

- *Intergrated MA*: Minimum 65% marks in the aggregate at Higher Secondary (HS 10+2) or equivalent exam. (5% relaxation for SC/ST candidates.) Students without Sanskrit at HS may also apply. Admissions begin in the month of May
- *M.Phil*, *Ph.D*: 65% marks in Sanskrit at the BA and MA level from a UGC recognized University. (5% relaxation for SC/ST). Only those with UGC NET-JRF (Junior Research Fellowship) are usually admitted. Admissions begin in June-July
- *Communicative Sanskrit:* Any one interested in learning Sanskrit may apply; no upper age limit. Admissions begin in January and June

- *Pratibhālokaḥ*: Annual Sanskrit journal of the students, by the students, for the students
- Vivekabhāskaraḥ: Quarterly wall magazine in Sanskrit for the students
- Dīpaśikhā: Quarterly e-magazine in Sanskrit edited by research scholars of the department
- Arthasangrahan: a book on Indian hermeneutics with original Sanskrit text,
 Bengali translation and a gloss vivṛti in Bengali (demi 1/8, pages 136) Rs.100/-

- Coaching sessions for UGC NET-JRF examination




- An exclusive women's wing
